





Oxymoron

The Paradox

Mark 9

- Mar 9:33 They came to Capernaum, and after going indoors Jesus asked his disciples, "What were you arguing about on the road?"
- Mar 9:34 But they would not answer him, because on the road they had been arguing among themselves about who was the greatest.
- Mar 9:35 Jesus sat down, called the twelve disciples, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must place himself last of all and be the servant of all."
- Mar 9:36 Then he took a child and had him stand in front of them.
 He put his arms around him and said to them,
- Mar 9:37 "Whoever welcomes in my name one of these children, welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me, welcomes not only me but also the one who sent me."

Matt 20

20 Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favor of him.

21 "What is it you want?" he asked.

She said, "Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom."

22 "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said to them. "Can you drink the cup I am going to drink?"

"We can," they answered.

23 Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by my Father."

24 When the ten heard about this, they were indignant with the two brothers. 25 Jesus called them together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. 26 Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, 27 and whoever wants to be first must be your slave— 28 just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Paradox

 A statement or proposition that seems selfcontradictory or absurd but in reality expresses a truth.



Level 5 Leaders

- Level 5 is the Executive who "builds enduring greatness through a paradoxical blend of personal humility and professional will." Every one of the good-to-great companies has level 5 leaders in the critical transition phase. None of the comparison companies did. These leaders are described as being timid and ferocious, shy and fearless and modest with a fierce, unwavering commitment to high standards.
- The Jack Welch's, the "Larger-than-life" celebrity leaders, who ride in from the outside are negatively correlated with taking a company from good-to-great.

... Level 5 Leaders

- Good-to-great leaders are self-effacing, quiet, reserved, and even shy - more like Lincoln and Socrates than Patton or Caesar.
- Level 5 leaders rely on instilling inspired standards and not inspiring charisma to motivate. They build a culture of discipline. It is not a tyrannical disciplinarian culture but one that enables freedom and responsibility.

... Level 5 Leaders

Level 5 leaders channel their ego needs away
from themselves and toward building a great
company or organisation. They often will sacrifice
their own gain for the gain of the company.

 Often the superhero CEO either eliminates any potential successors from his management team or chooses weak successors.

Who is a servant-leader?

Who is a servant-leader? Greenleaf said that the servantleader is one who is a servant first. In "The Servant as Leader" he wrote, "It begins with the natural feeling that one wants to serve, to serve first. Then conscious choice brings one to aspire to lead. The difference manifests itself in the care taken by the servant--first to make sure that other people's highest-priority needs are being **served**. The best test is: Do those served grow as persons; do they, while being served, become healthier, wiser, freer, more autonomous, more likely themselves to become servants? And what is the effect on the least privileged in society? Will they benefit or at least not be further deprived?"

Example from the political world ... who is the truly great leader?

 Well then, I will tell you. Alexander, Caesar, Charlemagne and I myself have founded great empires; but upon what did these creations of our genius depend? Upon force. Jesus alone founded His empire upon love, and to this very day millions will die for Him....


